

I SPY WALL QUILT

Approximate size: 34" x 42"

Fabric requirements:

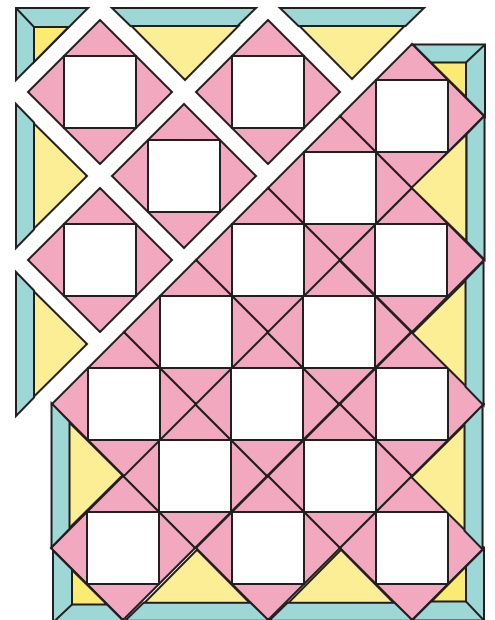
pink - 3/4 yd.
 yellow - 1/4 yd.
 blue - 1/4 yd.
 green - 2 yds. (includes border and back)
 white - 18 large print fabrics; each square
 is cut 4.75" x 4.75"; purchase 1/4 yds.
 or fat quarters

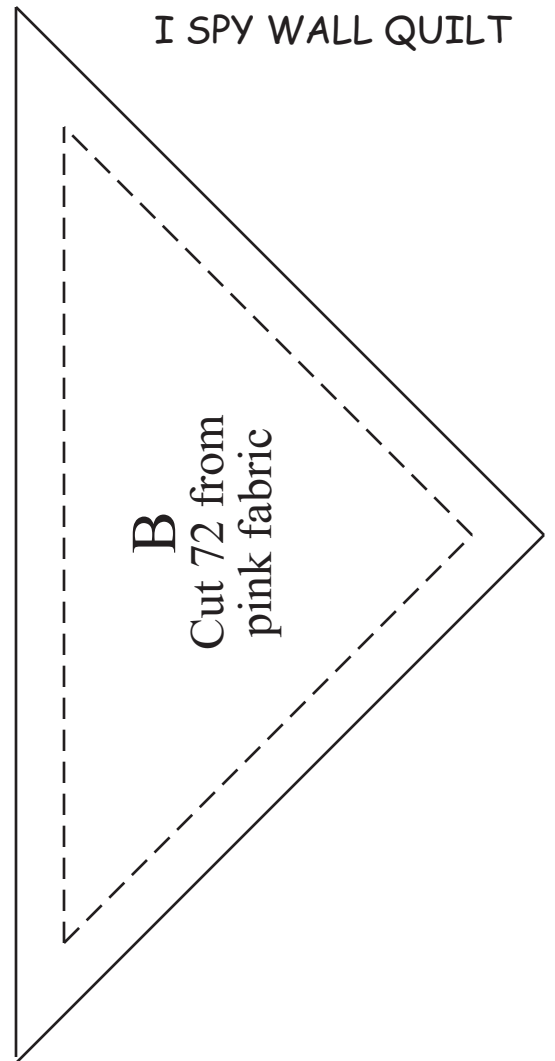
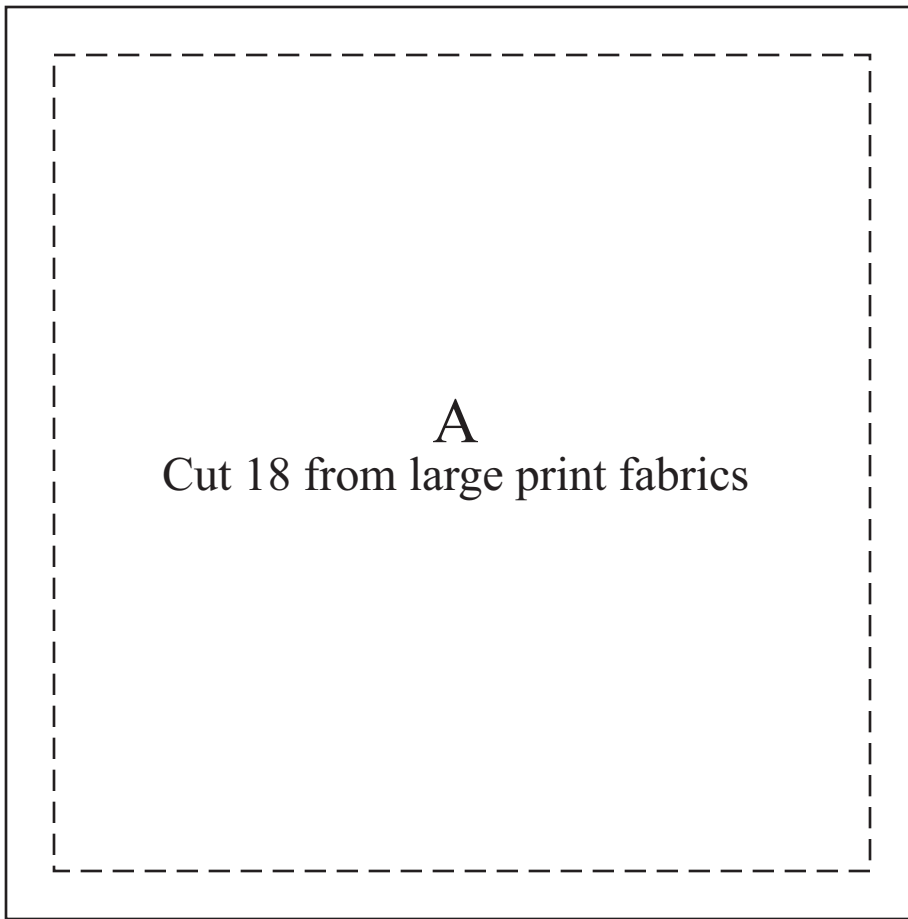
1. The colors on the diagram indicate areas rather than actual colors used in the finished quilt.
2. All seam allowances are 1/4".
3. This pattern may be printed for your use only. It may NOT be copied and distributed or sold.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Rubber cement the templates to lightweight cardboard. Cut out. Trace around each template the number of times indicated on the appropriate fabric. Cut out.
2. Stitch four B triangles to each A square. Press the seams toward the triangles.
 Stitch each D trapezoid to each C triangle. Press the seam toward the D trapezoid.
 Stitch two E trapezoids to each F triangle. Press the seams toward the E trapezoids.
3. Lay all the above pieces out on the floor as shown at right. Make sure all of the squares are facing the same direction. Rearrange the squares until you are pleased with their placement.
 Stitch the squares and triangles together to form diagonal rows. Press the seams toward one side.
 Starting in one corner, stitch the diagonal rows together. Press the seams to one side.
4. Cut four 4 1/2" wide border strips across the width of the green fabric. Stitch to the quilt. Miter the corners. Trim away excess fabric. Mark the quilting lines as indicated elsewhere in this pattern. Sandwich the batting between the top and back. Baste. Quilt. Trim the batting even with the top edge. Trim the back edge 3/4" wider than the top. Fold the back edge in half and fold over the top edge, overlapping by 1/4". Blind stitch the back edge to the top. Label your quilt. Stitch a casing on the back for hanging.

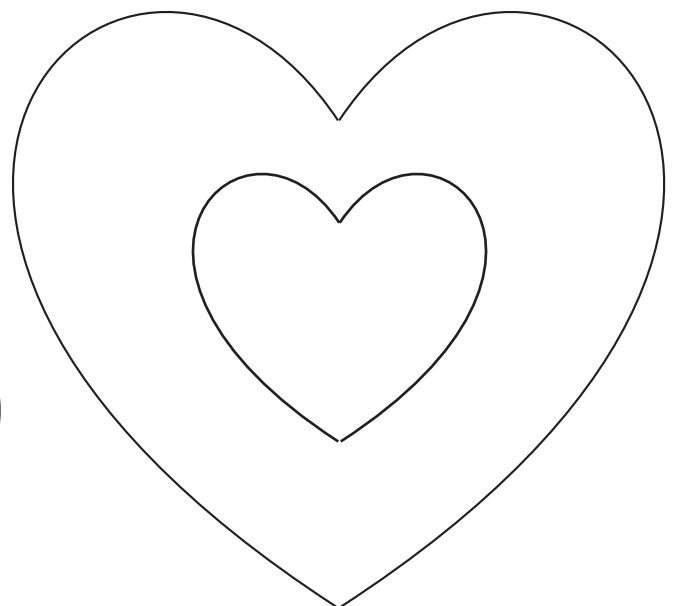
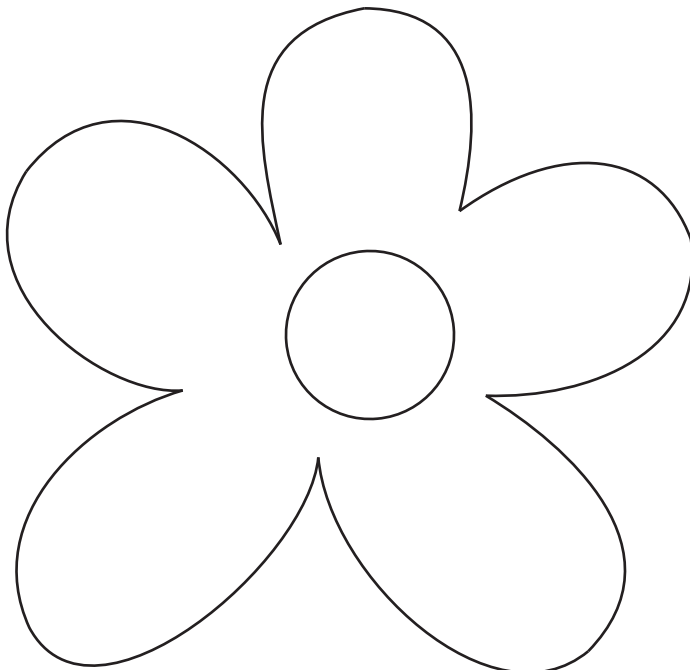


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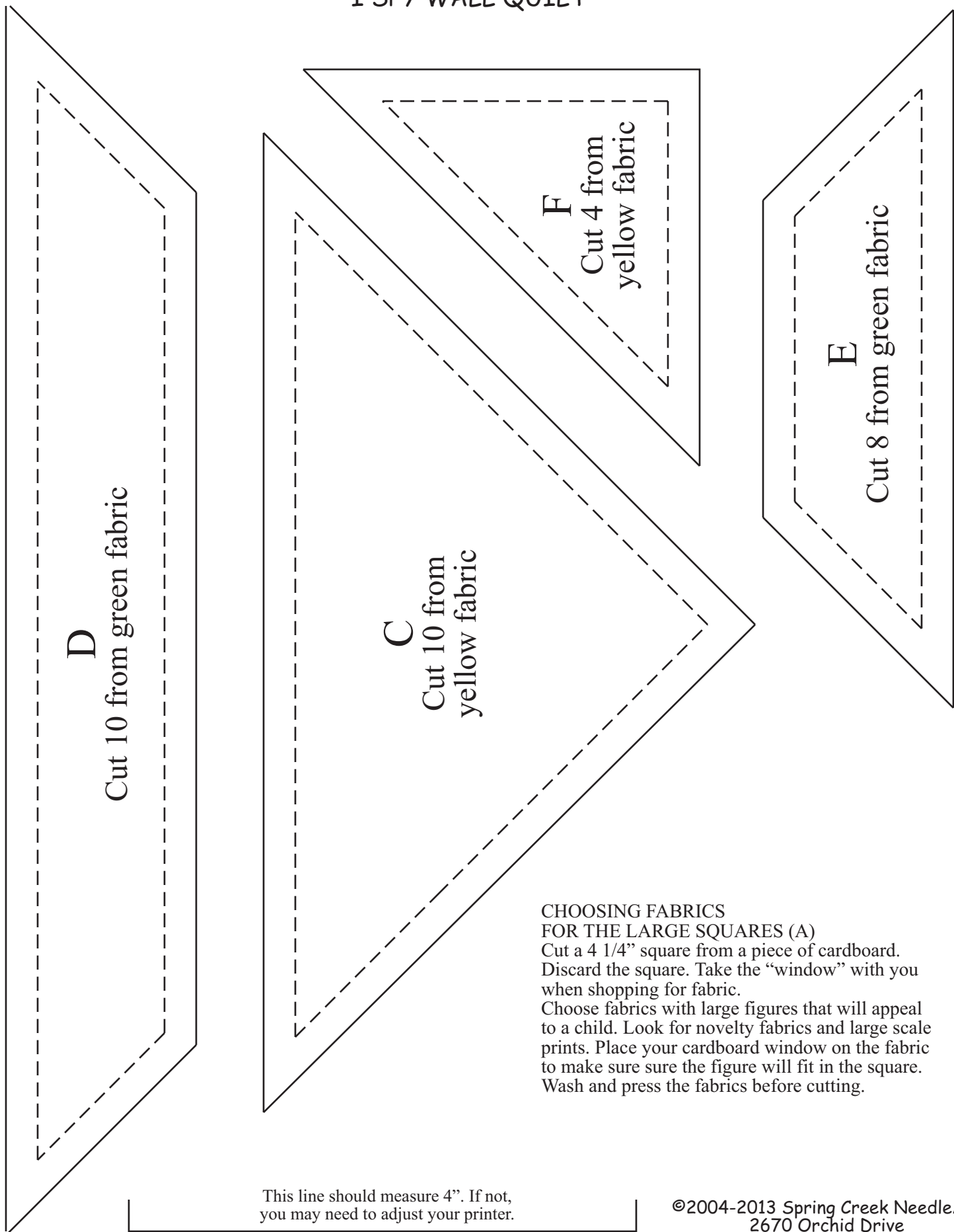


HEARTS & FLOWERS QUILTING TEMPLATES

Alternate the flower and large heart in the border. Quilt a large heart on the diagonal in each corner of the border. Flank the corner hearts with two of the small hearts. Quilt a large heart on the seven interior squares each formed from four B triangles. Quilt a small heart in each of the B triangles around the outside edge.

CHOOSING FABRICS FOR THE LARGE SQUARES (A)
Cut a 4 1/4" square from a piece of cardboard. Discard the square. Take the "window" with you when shopping for fabric. Choose fabrics with large figures that will appeal to a child. Look for novelty fabrics and large scale prints. Place your cardboard window on the fabric to make sure the figure will fit in the square. Wash and press the fabrics before cutting.

This line should measure 4". If not, you may need to adjust your printer.
